Overview of the school

At Springdale Primary School we have high aspirations for our children. We strongly believe that it is not about where you come from but your passion and thirst for knowledge, and your dedication and commitment to learning that make the difference between success and failure, and we are determined to ensure that our children are given every chance to realise their full potential.

We believe that one of the biggest barriers for children can be poverty of expectation and so are determined to create a climate that does not limit a child's potential in any way. We believe there is no "one size fits all" so it is essential that we identify individual barriers in order to provide personalised targeted support so that our children can flourish.

When making decisions about using pupil premium funding it is important to consider the context of the school and the subsequent challenges faced. Common barriers for FSM children can be less support at home, weak language and communication skills, lack of confidence, more frequent behaviour difficulties, and attendance and punctuality issues. There may also be complex family situations that prevent children from flourishing. The challenges are varied and there is no "one size fits all."

Our key objective in using the Pupil Premium Grant is to narrow the gap between pupil groups. Through targeted interventions we are working to eliminate barriers to learning and progress.

- Resources to deliver range of intervention programmes to accelerate progress in reading, writing and maths for PPG pupils
- Mentor / counselling service to identified pupils
- Full time grade 2 teaching assistant to provide in class support
- 31.25 hours of grade 2 teaching assistants to provide 1:1 and small group intervention

- Part time teacher for maths groups
- Part time teacher for booster groups and interventions
- Part funding of a parent support worker
